

Early Years Foundation Stage Curriculum

Learning in the foundation stage is active and in the moment. We promote a love of learning by encouraging children to be inquisitive and independent as well as developing their own self confidence. This year is the foundation of all further learning where we can develop children's attitude to learning, helping them to enjoy challenges and persevere to overcome problems.

Lots of our learning is done outside as this is where children often choose to be. A pair of wellies is essential and outdoor learning is not always clean and dry!

We follow the Early Years Foundation Stage Framework developing much of the children's learning through their own interests and developmental needs. Core learning is delivered through short interactive learning sessions as a whole class or group.

Phonic play an important part in the teaching of reading and phonic sessions are delivered daily following Letters and Sounds. Skills are then applied and developed throughout the day by adults involving themselves in child initiated play. Children read and share books individually each week.
