<u>English:</u> Our class reading book will be The Hodgeheg by Dick King-Smith. Children will respond to the text orally and in written form.

Class 3 will identify the features of Recounts,
Instructions and Non-Chronological Reports. They will
plan, edit and write non fiction and fiction texts. Big
Writing will take place every other week.

Weekly spellings will be sent home in a book and children will be tested.

Class 3 will practise using a dictionary and be able to put words into Alphabetical order. They will be able to identify and use verbs, nouns, adjectives and adverbs.

Ways to help at home

Mathematics: Class 3 will follow The Big Maths methods and be introduced to concepts such as Coin multiplication and jigsaw numbers. They will use formal methods to add and subtract numbers up to 3 digits. The 3 times table will be learned in and out of order.
