English:

Writing: We will be using Talk for Writing to learn the features of an instructional text. Children will then be able to use this to write their own set of instructions. We will continue to look at different forms of poetry

VCOP: VCOP sessions will teach the children to use **compound sentences**, writing using coordinating conjunctions. They will start sentences using **fronted adverbials** and use a range of punctuation within sentences.

Spelling: Weekly spellings will be linked to handwriting practice.

Maths:

Children will follow The **Big Maths** Methods and start lessons practising **coin multiplication**, **jigsaw numbers**, partitioning 2 dp numbers and counting in **multiples** of 6,7 and 8.

They will practise doubling and halving 2 and 3d numbers mentally using partitioning. They will use the term **factor** and find factor pairs for a given **product**. Children will practise using formal methods to add, subtract, divide and multiply.

Children will be looking at metric units of length, weight and capacity. They will measure and convert between the different units of measure.

History:

children will explore how the lives of people living in Britain changed thanks to the development of steam engines and the growth of the railway network across the country.

Year 4 will find out how steam engines work, the great breakthroughs made by industrialists and how the first underground railway was constructed.
